F-M Red River pedestrian bridges: get on the river

On Thursday, July 22 from 5-7 p.m., there will be an opportunity for the public to comment on a study related to the lifespan and replacement of the existing Red River pedestrian bridges in Fargo-Moorhead. The study will include an examination of alternatives for future replacement, alternatives for modification, and potentials for upgrading.

There will not be a formal presentation at the meeting but rather an opportunity to review the available information and speak with a transportation professional working on the project. Users of riverfront trails are aware of the problems with these structures including their unavailability for lengthy periods in the spring and during summer flooding. We encourage your attendance at this meeting.

The meeting will be held at the Case Plaza Building, 1 Second Street, #232, Fargo.
