# 2010 River Keepers Activities

**Board Leadership:** River Keepers' Board of Directors conducted two successful fundraising events, the Sister Rivers Luncheon and the Celebrate Our Red event at the HoDo. These efforts raised over \$10,000 for River Keepers.



**Riverfront Cleanups:** Continued to work with the City of Moorhead and the Fargo Park District on riverfront clean ups. With the assistance of AmeriCorps, many truck loads of woody debris were removed.





Storm Drain Marking Program: Worked with City of Fargo and City of Moorhead to provide the storm drain marking program. This program increases awareness about non-point source pollution. Over 100 participants contributed 255 volunteer hours.



**Land Trail Development:** Continued to encourage retrofitting of pedestrian bridges and increasing miles of riverfront trails.

### **Red River Water Festival:**

Coordinated our largest youth festival with over 1700 students attending over four days. Over 110 people volunteered 630 hours.



Red River of the North International Historic Canoe Trail: Working with MN Department of Natural Resources on adding canoe/kayak access sites and portages on the Red River. Construction started on a North Dam portage and enhanced fishing access project. Staff participates in the ND Trails Advisory Committee.



Partnered with the Fargo Park District and the FM Walleyes for the Lil' Fishermen's Derby and Clinic with over 200 youth and 150 adults participating. Provided two fishing clinics for the Fargo Public Library. Held a fishing clinic during Moorhead's RiverArts. Organized and managed a fun and a competitive canoe/kayak race. 30 teams participated. Forty volunteers provided over 100 volunteer hours helping make these events successful.

Sister Rivers: Received grant from Museums & Communities Collaboration Abroad to partner with Rodger Ehnstrom Nature Center, Eco-TIRAS, and Bendry Museum to form a "sister rivers' relationship with the Dniester River in Moldova. Visits to each others countries were made with tours of water projects and museums. Presentations were given to community leaders and youth about each others watershed



Youth Service Projects: Collaborated with Concordia College, NDSU, MSUM, MN School of Business, Fargo North, Barnesville High School, Ben Franklin Middle School, Bennett Elementary, Ellen Hopkins, Upward Bound, Boy Scouts of America, and 4-H Ambassadors on projects related to water quality monitoring, the Living Lab, storm drain marking program, T-shirt bags and the water festival. Almost 220 volunteers contributed 581 volunteer hours.



Water Quality Monitoring: 7 volunteers assisted in taking semimonthly samples during ice-free conditions. Participated in ND State Water Monitoring Council. Shared water quality monitoring procedures with Moldovans.



**Keeping Our River** Healthy:

Developed display and brochure with Cass County Soil Conservation District, Lake Agassiz RC&D and ND Department of Health to educate citizens about how garbage in yards and streets end up in ditches, storm drains and eventually the Red River. The display was used at many community events.



Workshops: Partnered wtih Cass Soil Conservation District to teach two Make Your Own Rain Barrel Workshops with 28 participants and two Make Your Own Compost Tumbler Workshops with 16 participants and Moorhead Community Education. Assembled and sold rain barrels. Partnered with Valley Earth Week Committee to coordinate Green Expo and other earth week activities.



Living Lab: Kicked off the elementary school backpack program with a grant from Xcel Energy. Thanks to an Experience Works employee, the site was well maintained. Installed more interpretive signs and a rain garden. About 100 volunteers contributed over 350 hours.







Canoeing, Cooking and Camping: Coordinated the 5th annual women's weekend on the Red River with 11 participants.

**Dam Safety:** Continue to work with MN Department of Natural Resources and others on Christine and Hickson Dam issues.
