Board Leadership:

River Keepers' Board of Directors conducted four successful fundraising events that raised almost \$15,000 for River Keepers! These volunteers also participated in an educational tour of the Red River and its amenities in Fargo-Moorhead.





Riparian Restoration:

Along with the Cass County Soil Conservation District, City of Fargo, and Fargo Park District, coordinated Plant it 4 the Planet and Reforest the Red to celebrate Arbor Day. Over 300 volunteers planted 1200 trees and shrubs.



Downtown Riverfront Cleanup: Along with City of Fargo Forestry, Fargo Park District Forestry, and City of Moorhead, the Red River Clean Team, managed by River Keepers, removed two tons of tree trimmings and 400 pounds of trash from the downtown riparian area. They also planted over 300 trees.

With the support of the North Dakota Department of Health, Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, and the assistance of volunteers, we took semimonthly water quality samples during ice-free conditions. With grant support from the Minnesota Department of Health, River Keepers convened an advisory group and researched community outreach messages and protocols for pharmaceutical disposal.

Red River Watershed Center:

River Keepers, the International Water Institute (IWI), and the Red River Basin Commission have established common office space at 1120 28th Avenue North, Suite B in Fargo, All three non-profit organizations have water-related missions and have agreed to collocate in the Red River Watershed Center to increase efficiency and explore expanded opportunities to work together.



Staff also participates in activities such as the Metropolitan Council of Government's Bike and Pedestrian Committee where we advocate for more riverfront trails and



On-the-Water Clean-Ups:

Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, we were able to replace an old balky outboard with an excellent low polluting motor that starts every time! Volunteers including a scout family with the assistance of staff cleaned up several reaches of the Red.



S.S. Ruby and Canoe & Kayak Rentals:

Almost 1500 passengers heard about the Red River via the S.S. Ruby.

Geotagging Intern:

Thanks to the support of the Barry Foundation, we had an eager full time summer intern that 'geotagged' the urban reaches of the Red. Geotagging is combining photographs with GPS location. Among other uses, this data is used in reforestation plantings.

Storm Drain Marking Program:

Collaborated with City of Fargo, City of Moorhead, Concordia College, Fraser, and a Boy Scout group to mark storm drains with a "Do Not Dump" message. Over 60 volunteers contributed 124 volunteer hours.




Living Lab:

After our lease was cancelled at the Living Lab, we continue to research potential replacement sites.



Red River Water Festival:

Annual hands on educational festival with 1600 students (78 classes) attending over four days. About 100 people volunteered 700 hours.



Water Trail:

Advocated for additional access and riverfront camping sites. We continue encouraging the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources to resolve issues related to the failed portage/enhanced fishing access project at the North Dam.



Workshops:

Partnered with Cass County Soil Conservation District and Moorhead Community Education to produce a Make Your Own Rain Barrel Workshop, a Make Your Own Compost Tumbler Workshop, and a Composting Workshop. Assembled and sold rain harrels
