2017 River Keepers Highlights



Worked with an NDSU student to refresh our website utilizing user friendly software.



On-the-Water Recreation:

Organized Race the Red canoe and kayak races with 52 vessels participating in a new flag format. Partnered with Moorhead Parks and Recreation to offer 4 River Paddling Excursions with over 60 vessel participating. We also partnered with Moorhead Parks and Recreation on summer Canoe & Kavak Rentals at Hiemkomst. Landing Partnered with International Water Institute and Wilderness Inquiry to bring the Canoemobile to the Red River with 60 participants.



Fishing:

Coordinated an "Advanced Catfishing Seminar" with Brad Durick with over 30 participants. Coordinated Lil' Fisherman's Derby & Clinic and RiverArts Fishing Clinic with FM Walleyes Fargo Park District and Moorhead Parks and Recreation with over 150 youth participants. Received a donation to distribute Relaxed Anglers Guide to Catfishing on the Red River of the North to books to schools in the basin.



M.B. Johnson Park

Along with the City of Fargo, Fargo Park District, and Cass County Soil Conservation District a 10-year Reforest the Red plan was drafted. Over 10,000 trees and shrubs were planted by almost 1000 volunteers contributing almost 2000 volunteer hours and some machine planting along the Red River in Fargo and Moorhead.
Designed riparian interpretive signs to be installed along the Red with funding from the National Fish & Wildlife Foundation.



Best Management Practices:

Partnered with Cass County Soil Conservation District, Clay County Soil and Water Conservation District and Moorhead Community Education to increase the number of Make Your Own Rais Barrel Workshops and Make Your Own Compost Tumbler Workshops to 3 each with almost 50 participants.

Geocache:

Partnered with Moorhead Parks and Recreation and a volunteer to develop the RiverEd 4 geocache which debuted during Frostival.

Volunteers

Over 1700 (up 600 over last year) volunteers contributed over 4800 hours to River Keepers' projects, events and committees. Participated in Creating Good to recruit volunteers with professional skills.

Storm Drain Marking Program:

Collaborated with City of Fargo, City of Moorhead, and over 150 volunteers (which included 3 Eagle Scout projects) that contributed 425 volunteer hours to mark storm drains with a "Do Not Dump" message and distribute doorhangers.



Board Involvement:

Board members recruited members, participated in Board and Committee meeting to ensure the organization is run effectively, and raised funds through our Catfish Cup golf scramble and Celebrate Our Red at the HoDo





Clean ups:
Partnered with the City of
Moorhead to pick up 850 pounds of
trash in the downtown section of
the river weekly. Worked with an
Eagle Scout to coordinate an on-the -water clean up plus River Keepers coordinated a fall downtown on-the -water clean up. Worked with City of Moorhead and Fargo Park District to coordinate bank clean ups with volunteers.



Water Quality: With the support from the North Dakota Department of Health, Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, and the assistance of volunteers, we took semi-monthly water quality samples at 4 locations during icefree conditions



T-shirt to Tote Project:

Produced and distributed about 2000 totes made from T-shirts that were donated, cut, and sewn by over 225 volunteers providing over 450 v olunteer hours.



Youth Education:

40 Ave S

Over 2100 4th grade students (97 classes from 33 schools) attended the Red River Water Festival over five days. Over 100 volunteers provided 600 volunteer hours. Partnered with the Fargo Project on a family Water Festival. Led a River Detective Camp with West Fargo Parks. Led activities at community events such as Midwest Kidfest, Police Community Picnic Party for the Planet. About 200 boy scouts attended a day camp in which River Keepers led a water cycle activity.

Make Your Own Rain Barrel Workshops:

by reducing storm water runoff, which can contain pollutants such as sediment, oil, grease, bacteria and chemicals. In addition, build and bring home a rain barrel made from a plastic 55-gallon barrel. Taught with Cass County Soil Conservation District and Clay County Soil and Water Conservation District. to regenerate poor soils, reduce erosion and help prevent pollution in our water ways. We will cover the basics of composting. In addition, build and bring home a compost tumbler made from a plastic 55-gallon barrel. Taught with Cass Soil Conservation District and Clay County Soil and Water Conservation District. 
