Goal: Increase public awareness of the Red River, its uses, and water related issues by disseminating accurate information and engaging in educational activities.

Increase public awareness:

- Absolute Marketing Group choose to work with River Keepers to give us a refreshed logo; a new slogan: Learn, Sustain, and Enjoy; a brand etiquette guide; and an Instagram account.
- Projects and events were covered by media outlets over 30 times. Displayed at almost 20 events and presented to over 15 groups.
- A volunteer created a photo booth prop with people enjoying and helping to sustain the Red River to use at events.



Provide educational opportunities:

- Over 2100 4th grade students (97 classes from 32 schools) attended the Red River Water Festival over five days.



- Worked with the Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County to add a local interactive component to the We Are Water exhibit.
- Led activities at community events such as Midwest Kidfest, Police Community Picnic, Moorhead Summer Parks Program, Party for the Planet, and River Hero Camp.
- Partnered with the Red River Zoo and Giacaches to create our 4th geocache.

Offer guided tours:

- Partnered with Moorhead Parks and Recreation to offer 4 Paddling Excursions with over 100 participants.

Goal: Maintain and increase appropriate recreational use of the Red River.

Serve as a source of information about recreation:

- Partnered with FM Walleyes Unlimited to provide 2 youth fishing clinics with 120 participants.
- Coordinated Race the Red with 72 vessels registered! Held first Best Decorated Contest during the Race.



- Hosted Efficiency in Catfishing Seminar with Brad Durick with 18 participants.

Provide canoe and kayak rental:

- Partnered with Moorhead Parks and Recreation to provide canoe and kayak rentals at Hjemkomst Landing with almost 700 renters.

Goal: Advocate land use, river use, and environmental practices that contribute to a sustainable, safe, and economically beneficial river ecosystem.

Encourage best management practices:

- Partnered with Cass County Soil Conservation District, Clay County Soil and Water Conservation District and Moorhead Community Education to produce 2 Make Your Own Rain Barrel Workshops and 3 Make Your Own Compost Tumbler Workshops and a new Pollinator Habitat Workshop.
- Along with the City of Fargo, Fargo Park District, Cass County Soil Conservation District, City of Moorhead and Clay County Soil & Water Conservation District, over 1000 volunteers planted trees and shrubs to Reforest the Red during 3 events.



- Received Clay County Soil & Water Conservation District's Outstanding Conservationist Award.



Reduce threats to Red River's water quality:

- Produced and distributed hundreds of totes from T-shirts that were donated, cut, and sewn by over 300 volunteers in our T-shirt to Tote project.
- The City of West Fargo joined the City of Fargo and the City of Moorhead as a partner in our Storm Drain

Marking Program. Almost 300 volunteers contributed 570 volunteer hours to mark storm drains with a "Do Not Dump" message and distributed doorhangers.

- Partnered with the Moorhead Parks and Recreation and Fargo Park District to work with almost 300 volunteers to pick up trash along the Red River.



Conduct water quality monitoring:

- With the support of the North Dakota Department of Health, Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, and the assistance of volunteers, we took semi-monthly water quality samples during ice-free conditions.

- Celebrate Our Red at the HoDo and the Catfish Cup Golf Scramble were successful fundraisers led by the Board of Directors.

Make Your Own Rain Barrel Workshops:
